Why should I join?

- COVID-19 continues to be a public health problem in rural communities.

- You may find out if you have COVID-19 or influenza.

Who can join?

Anyone who lives in or around the Marshfield area may be eligible to participate.

What do I have to do for the study?

- You would need to answer some questions every week for 52 weeks.
- You would need to collect a nose sample (from inside the front of your nose) and mail the sample to us, if requested. You may be asked to collect a nose sample every week for 26 weeks, or only if you feel sick.
- You would need to come to Marshfield Medical Center (medical offices) in Marshfield for at least 3 blood draws, some people will be asked to provide up to 3 more blood samples.
- You will not receive any treatments or vaccines.
